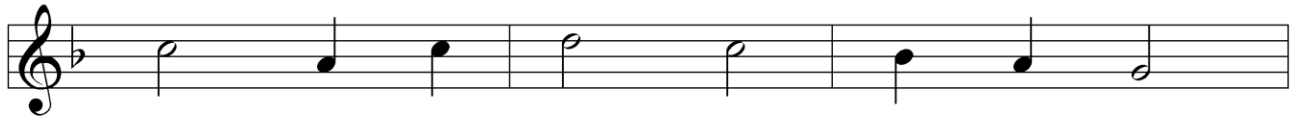

SECOND LESSON: Ephesians 1:3-14

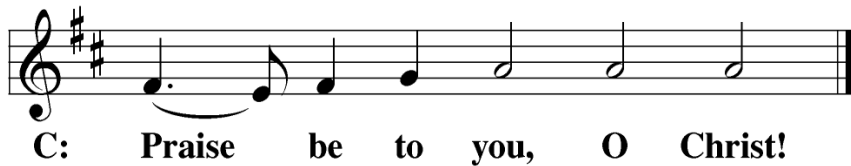
