






CONFESSION OF SINS

LORD, HAVE MERCY (Kyrie)





SECOND LESSON: 2 Corinthians 8:1-9

8 We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, ² for in a severe test of the affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³ For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own

accord, ⁴ begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints — ⁵ and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us. ⁶ Accordingly, we urged Titus that as he had started, so he should complete among you this act of grace. ⁷ But as your excel in everything — in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you — see that you excel in this act of grace also.
