




## FIRST LESSON: Malachi 3:1-7b

**3** "Behold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. # GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 3:1-6

**3** In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and


## WORDS OF INSTITUTION


