






CONFESSION OF SINS


FIRST LESSON: Genesis 45:3-15







My sins beyond recall are all alike on Jesus laid, He died to bear them all.



PRESCHOOL/YOUNG 5S AND PARENTS AND TOT REGISTRATION 2025-2026

Registration is now open for the 2025-2026 school year for our church members and returning families. It will open up to everyone on February 16.

We have a Parent and TOT program for two year olds and their caregiver (parent, grandparent, nanny, etc.). This program meets once a week for 1.5 hours and will begin in September.
